The contract for the room rates and room block has been signed. Room rates are \$79.00 per night, double occupancy, breakfast included. Rooms are subject to a tax of 14.5%. For reservations call 1-800-395-7046 or (608) 833-0100. To ensure you receive the group rate please make reservations by July 27th, 2012, and mention that they are for the USS Topeka Reunion. It is very important that reservations are made under the USS Topeka Reunion banner so we can meet our room count commitment.

HOTEL SHUTTLE

If you are considering flying into Madison and renting a car at the airport, My suggestion is don't. Take the free shuttle provided by the Radisson and when you want a car both Avis and Enterprise have offices within a block of the hotel. This way you only need to rent the vehicle when needed and not pay the airport surcharges.

Let the hotel know 24 hours before your flight the flight number and scheduled arrival time. They will then track the flight and do their best to have the shuttle at the airport on your arrival. They will also be providing shuttle service to facilities within a couple miles of the hotel. This includes a major regional shopping center and a multitude of fine restaurants. Just ask Paul for recommendations on local restaurants for most any taste and budget.

WEATHER

Weather is a major topic in Madison; Madisonians love to talk about weather! But for a place ranging in temperatures between -20 to 100 the topic does deserve some attention. Madison summers are for the most part very sunny and pleasant. The surrounding marshlands can bring the humidity up quite high and some days turn into scorches.

HOSPITALITY ROOM

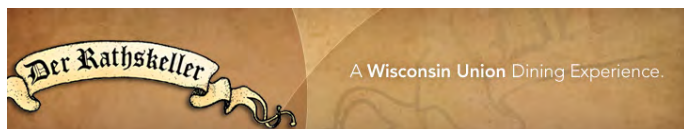


ABOUT MEMORIAL UNION

The Wisconsin Union is one organization comprised of two buildings—Memorial Union and Union South.

Opened on October 5, 1928, the Memorial Union sits on the shores of Lake Mendota between Helen C. White Library and the Armory (Red Gym). This building is most recognized for its classic architecture and bright green, orange and yellow starburst Terrace chairs.

The Memorial Union is used by UW students, faculty, staff, Wisconsin Union Members and the Madison community for a variety of social and educational activities.



Der Rathskeller—located in Memorial Union—is a favorite gathering place for students, staff and community members. With a German beer hall feel and a variety of pub food classics, it’s an ideal spot to watch a band sponsored by the [Wisconsin Union Directorate](#) or a Badger game on the 15 ft screen.

Enjoy brats, hamburgers, grilled chicken and hot dogs fresh off the grill, sweet corn and an assortment of cold beverages



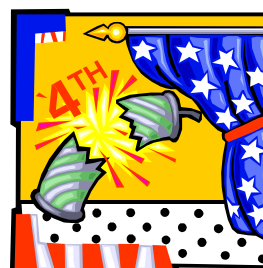
TOPEKA’S COMMANDING OFFICERS

In her nearly ten years of service as CLG-8, Topeka had eight commanding officers:

Captain Frank L. Pinney Jr.	March, 1960 – November, 1960
Captain Fredrick E. Janney	November 1960 – September 1961
Captain Roger W. Paine	September 1961 – October 1962
Captain Jack E. Mansfield	October, 1962 – December 1964
Captain William J. Ruhe	December 1964 – October 1965
Captain Thomas C. Buell	November 1964 – June, 1966
Captain William M. Montgomery	June 1966 – November, 1967
Captain George G. Halvorson	November 1967 – June, 1969

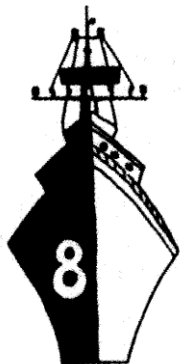
All served with distinction during World War II earning many battle awards. Three went on to flag rank after leaving Topeka (Captains Janney, Paine, and Halvorson) and one authored two books about his war experiences as well as writing a song for submariners (Captain Ruhe).

With the passing of Captain Montgomery on January 17, 2012 all are now gone. It’s the end of an era.

Our deluxe motor coach will depart at 9am. We travel to the Wollersheim Winery in Prairie du Sac. The natural beauty surrounding the winery has been the backdrop for a remarkable historical heritage, one told in rich detail during the winery's guided tour. The tour points out interesting aspects of the property, which has earned a listing in the National Register of Historical Places. Following the tour, we get to taste a sampling of Wollersheim wines. The basic guidelines of wine tasting are explained.

Our next stop is Carr Valley Cheese. Carr Valley's Cheese makers are undoubtedly the best in the business with over 220 years of experience, crafting the world's finest cheddars and signature American Originals. Experience room-rumbling performances by automated music machines including the awe-inspiring Mikado. Stroll the red-bricked Streets of Yesterday, admire lovely ivory carvings, suits of armor and sparkling crown jewels. Spend the morning here exploring.

We depart and go to the Old Feed Mill Restaurant in Mazomanie. Nestled against the bluffs of the Wisconsin River Valley, Mazomanie are an intriguing mix of history, nature, art and warm community spirit. The Old Fee Mill strives to replicate this unique blend of qualities in their business. Enjoy an old fashioned Wisconsin cookout– including brats, burgers, chicken and all the fixins'. Of course beverage, dessert tax and tip are all included! A great look at Old World Wisconsin at its best!

Friday, August 24th, Tour D, 8:45am-3pm This is Madison

Join us as we visit some of the places that make Madison the great place it is– to live in and to visit. A step on guide will give us a quick tour of the area– highlighting the history and mystery of this fine town. Our first stop is the Wisconsin Capitol building–the tallest building in Madison. We will have a docent guided tour and learn about the architecture and history of the capitol building.

From here we will go to the Wisconsin Veteran's Museum. The Museum is dedicated to the citizen-soldiers of our state. Employing exhibits, displays, and presentations, the museum's main galleries tell the story of Wisconsin men and women who served in America's conflicts from the Civil War to the Persian Gulf War..

Next is a visit to the University of Wisconsin Memorial Union where you can have lunch—maybe at Der Rathskellar or the Brat Stand? And don't forget to try some Babcock Ice Cream! After lunch we will continue with a short tour of the University area– including a drive by Camp Randall–home of the Wisconsin Badgers– but once used as a Civil War Training Camp and also as a stockade and hospital for confederate prisoners of war. .

The Civil war connection continues as we visit Confederate Rest Cemetery and pay tribute to fallen soldiers. In April of 1862, over 1000 members of the 1st Alabama Infantry Regiment were brought to Camp Randall as prisoners of war. Over the next 2 months, 140 prisoners lost their lives (one prisoner was shot by a guard, the other 139 died from disease and/or their wounds.) They are buried at Forest Hill Cemetery in a section known as Confederate Rest. This is the northern most Confederate Cemetery in the U.S.
